## **BENEFITS & COSTS OF MNCS:**


What happens when a multinational like Wal-Mart comes to town...

- Employment Opportunities:
  - Benefit: Large number of jobs available to the local community
  - Cost: Exploit labor with low wages and difficult working conditions. Undermine the ability of workers to form a union.
- Local Taxes:
  - Benefit: More taxes paid contributes to services that the gov't can provide
  - Cost: Demand tax breaks or favorable zoning / regulations as a condition of building a new store in the area
- Community Services:
  - Benefit: Offers a wide variety of goods at affordable prices
  - Cost: Threatens smaller local businesses who cannot compete

## **MULTINATIONAL CORPORATIONS (MNCS)**

MNCs are huge global businesses that operate in many countries simultaneously

- By 2000, 51 of the world's 100 largest economic units were TNCs, not countries.
- Employ a large numbers of workers globally
- Exert political influence because of their global economic power














"American Empire": For many, opposition to corporate freetrade globalization = opposition to growing U.S. power and influence in the world.








## **GREEN AND GLOBAL**

- Environmentalism only became a global phenomenon in the late 20<sup>th</sup> century.
- Rachel Carson's book Silent Spring (1962) became the catalyst for grassroots citizen protest
- "Environmental justice" calls attention to unequal environmental impact on the poor
- Green political parties form passing legislation to control pollution in many countries and encourage research on alternative energy source
